Per agreement with the Rockingham County Attorney and Assistant Commissioner of Safety Robert Quinn all possible future charging decisions regarding this investigation will be made at the discretion and authorization of the RCAO.

Exeter police Department received its initial complaint report around April 2016 beginning with an investigation into alleged criminal activities on the Phillips Exeter Academy campus by a former staff member.

Media coverage of the topic, plus an alumni letter written by current Principle Lisa McFarland generated numerous tips from current/former students and staff regarding the handling of reported violations on campus and the culture surrounding reporting sexual activity/assault on campus.

On or about May 23, 2016 Cpt. Munck, EPD provided a disc of all pertinent case file documentation of "tips" received regarding PEA. (See attached disc with PDF file of EPD closed/open cases)

On June 16, 2016 Criminal Analyst Tracey Flaherty conducted a comprehensive analysis of the approximatelý 58 reviewable tips gathered by the Exeter Police Department. Regarding non-reporting concerns Analyst Flaherty found:

- Of the 58 tips available for review, 17 tips suggest that PEA staff were aware of allegations of sexual/physical abuse and failed to report to PEA Security, DCYF and/or law enforcement.
- 14 of the 17 tips reveal separate allegations from 1973-2015 involving 11 different suspects.
- The remaining 3 reports reveal separate allegations from 1963-1997 in which PEA was allegedly aware of inappropriate behavior, however the suspect is either unknown or the witness/victim is unwilling to provide names.

All tips provided by Exeter Police Department as of 5/27/2016 were reviewed for non-reporting issues by Phillips Exeter Academy (PEA) staff members. In addition, allegations were identified that may require follow up by NH State Police to determine if non-reporting issues exist.

#### **Non-Reporting Concerns**

- Of the 58 tips available for review, 17 tips suggest that PEA staff were aware of allegations of sexual/physical abuse and failed to report to PEA Security, DCYF and/or law enforcement.
- 14 of the 17 tips reveal allegations from 1973 2015 involving 11 different suspects.
- The remaining 3 reports reveal separate allegations from 1963 1997 in which PEA was allegedly aware of inappropriate behavior, however the suspect is either unknown or the witness/victim is unwilling to provide names.
- See spreadsheet detailing information for each of the 17 tips. An additional spreadsheet is available that provides information for each subject. Below is a summary:

#### Suspects:

- Arthur PEEKEL former PEA Admissions Officer arrested May 2016 for alleged sexual assault of a teenage student in 1973.

In January 2017, Exeter Police Department provided NHSP with 17 additional reports for review. The original case management spreadsheet has been updated with the additions and any case status changes.

- Of the 17 new reports, 5 tips suggest that PEA staff were aware of allegations of sexual/physical abuse and falled to report to PEA Security, DCYF and/or law enforcement.
- These 5 tips reveal allegations from the 1950s 2015 involving 5 different suspects and are summarized below.

- Rick SCHUBART former PEA Director of AD is a suspect in 5 additional allegations of sexual

- 4. according to Report# 16-286-OF, a former PEA student is alleged to have sexually abused a fellow female student.
  - a. 1982 1983 victim was 14 years old living at PEA and feels she was molested by for several months.
  - b. The situation was reported to Dean Susan Henry at the time. The school did very little. The victim ended up switching dorms and seeking counseling from a private party outside the school.
  - c. The suspect stayed at the school.
  - d. No known reporting to DCYF or Exeter PD.
  - e. Exeter PD contacted the victim in May 2016 and she does not want to pursue an investigation.
- - a. The victim allegedly contacted Dean Ron Kim, but wanted to keep their conversation confidential.
  - b. No known reporting to DCYF or Exeter PD.
  - c. is presumed to be deceased.

The following 4 reports, involve other allegations of inappropriate sexual activity that may require follow up. In these instances, PEA was either unaware of the activity or took some action to address the behavior.

The victims allege inappropriate touching and over sharing of information regarding his finances and sex life. Exeter PD obtained contact information for 3 female students; however they do not want to assist in furthering an investigation into conduct.

I informed him of the pending investigation of the institution and its staff regarding possible violations of RSA 169-C Child Protection Act, Mandatory Reporting Law. Chief referred me to Attorney David Vicinanzo of the Nixon Peabody Law firm stating they were representing the institution in such matters.

On June 23, 2016 I attended a meeting regarding this investigation at the offices of Nixon Peabody, LLP 900 Elm St. in Manchester, NH. The attendees were Attorney David Vicinanzo, Attorney Daniel Deane, PEA Chief Detailed, Det. Mallory Littman, and me. The discussion centered on NH State Police participation in the Rockingham County Attorney Office/Exeter Police Department investigation and the current criminal investigation into mandatory reporting law violations.

Att. Vicinanzo was clear in that their firm was representing the institution and all employees, staff, and students in any matter relating to the reporting of possible criminal activity to authorities or law enforcement officials. Att. Vicinanzo stated that they would consider whether or not to supply law enforcement with any student discipline files, faculty discipline files, active/former student rosters and contact information, active/former employee rosters and contact information, etc. (As of January 20, 2017 none of these files have been supplied.)

Att. Vicinanzo stated that it was his belief there should be a "protocol" in place for possible law enforcement contact with Academy personnel, part of this protocol would be the firms participation in structuring contact and having active involvement in any matter and/or interview. I informed him that our investigative plan was confidential and we would not seek a "structuring" upon their wishes as it may hinder witness(es) from being forthcoming or trusting our independence from the institution itself.

Att. Vicinanzo stated that their primary concern was improvement of ourrent practices, and explained that any possible reporting law violations to this point were merely misunderstandings and/or lack of training for staff on handling these matters. He was clear in their collective belief that

no criminal intent was afoot. Att. Vicinanzo maintained that the institution wished to be "transparent", and that training for employees and students was the key to resolving these matters.

At the conclusion of the meeting I informed Chief that we would like to start interviewing various employees, such as current security personnel, to see if they had information pertinent to our investigation, Att. Vicinanzo was not present for this conversation.

Approximately 15 minutes after leaving the meeting I received a call from Att. Vicinanzo stating that he had spoken to Chief Gravel and was informed of our plan to go to campus to begin interviewing employees of PEA. Att. Vicinanzo informed me that as legal counsel for all Phillips Exeter Academy employees, staff, and students he was forbidding any contact directly or indirectly with anyone associated with the institution, and that he would begin negotiations with the Rockingham County Attorney's Office. I informed Deputy Rockingham County Attorney Patricia LaFrance of the conversation with Att. Vicinanzo.
